## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "General Aviation Pilot
- 5 Protection Act of 2013".

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## SEC. 2. MEDICAL CERTIFICATION OF CERTAIN SMALL AIR CRAFT PILOTS.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the 4 5 Federal Aviation Administration shall issue or revise medical certification regulations to ensure that an individual 6 7 may operate as pilot in command of a covered aircraft without regard to any medical certification or proof of 8 health requirement otherwise applicable under Federal law 9 if— 10

(1) the individual possesses a valid State driver's license and complies with any medical requirement associated with that license;

14 (2) the individual is transporting not more than15 5 passengers;

16 (3) the individual is operating under visual17 flight rules; and

18 (4) the relevant flight, including each portion19 thereof, is not carried out—

20 (A) for compensation, including that no
21 passenger or property on the flight is being car22 ried for compensation;

23 (B) at an altitude that is more than
24 14,000 feet above mean sea level;

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1	(C) outside the United States, unless au-
2	thorized by the country in which the flight is
3	conducted; or
4	(D) at a speed exceeding 250 knots.
5	(b) COVERED AIRCRAFT DEFINED.—In this section,
6	the term "covered aircraft" means an aircraft that—
7	(1) is not authorized under Federal law to carry
8	more than 6 occupants; and
9	(2) has a maximum certificated takeoff weight
10	of not more than 6000 pounds.
11	SEC. 3. REPORT.
12	Not later than 5 years after the date of enactment
13	of this Act, the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Ad-
14	ministration shall submit to Congress a report that de-
15	scribes the impact that the regulations issued or revised
16	under section 2 have had, including statistics with respect
17	to changes in small aircraft activity and safety incidents.
